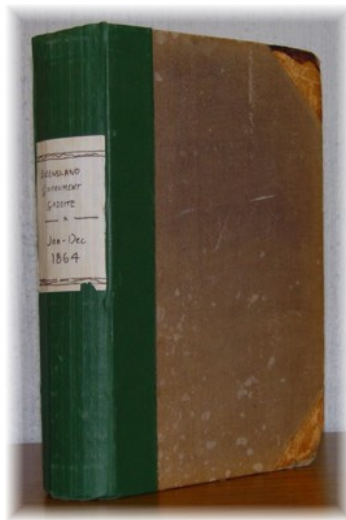

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Queensland and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Proclamations, dated the 2nd day of February, 1861, and 13th day of March, 1861, respectively, certain portions of lands situated in the vicinity of Maryborough and the Mary River, were defined and set apart for agricultural occupation, in terms of the Act 24 Victoria, No. 15, and were declared to be Agricultural Reserves, with certain limits in such Proclamation set forth; And whereas it has been deemed expedient to alter and amend the boundaries of the said Agricultural Reserves: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power in me vested, and with the advice of the Executive Council, and by authority of the Act 27 Victoria, No. 23, styled "*Agricultural Reserves Act of 1863*," do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the boundaries of the Agricultural Reserves at Maryborough and the Mary River respectively, shall be defined within the limits hereunder set forth, that is to say—

1. *Amended boundaries of the Maryborough Agricultural Reserve—About Eleven thousand Acres.*

Commencing on the left bank of the Mary River, at the north-east corner of portion No. 1 of the Maryborough Agricultural Reserve, and bounded thence on the north by a line bearing west two and a-half miles; on the west by a line bearing south to Myrtle Creek; on the south by Myrtle Creek downwards to the Mary River; and on the east by the Mary River downwards to the point of commencement.

2. *Amended boundaries of the Mary River Agricultural Reserve—About Nineteen thousand seven hundred and fifty Acres.*

Commencing on the right bank of the Mary River, at the north-west corner of portion No. 1 of the Mary River Agricultural Reserve, and bounded thence on the north by a line bearing east three miles; on the east by a line bearing south till it meets the easterly prolongation of the north boundary lines of portions Nos. 1, 3, and 4, in the parish of Tiaro; on the south by a line west and by the north boundary lines of said portions Nos. 1, 3, and 4, bearing west to the Mary River; and on the west by the Mary River downwards to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Government House, Brisbane, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH LINE.

TENDERS will be received at this Office until Noon on **TUESDAY**, the first day of March next, from persons desirous of contracting for the supply of all materials (except wire, insulating pins, and insulators), and for all workmanship necessary (except stretching wire) for the erection of the undermentioned Line of Telegraph, according to the Terms, General Conditions, and Specification appended hereto.

From Rockhampton to Gladstone, following generally the line of road, and now being marked by the Engineer of Roads. The contract to be completed, and the works handed over to the Government within five months from the notification of the acceptance of the Tender.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

Payment will be made to the extent of seventy-five (75) per cent. on the value of the work certified for, by the officer appointed to inspect the same, to have been completed at the end of every second month, and the total balance will be paid when the entire contract shall have been completed to the satisfaction of the Government.

Should the contractor fail to proceed in the execution of, or to complete the work in the manner, and at the rate of progress, required by the Government, it shall be in the power of the Government, by a notice in the *Queensland Government Gazette*, to terminate the contract so far as relates to the work remaining to be done, and to enforce the penalties for non-fulfilment of the contract.

Attached to each Tender there must be a memorandum, signed by the party tendering, and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be answerable for the due performance of the contract within the time stipulated, in event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking in that event that they will severally execute and deliver at the office of the Crown Solicitor, in Brisbane, within ten (10) days from the notification of the acceptance of the Tender, a bond to Her Majesty, for securing such performance, in a sum equal to twenty (20) per cent. on the amount of Tender.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any Tender.

SPECIFICATION.

Posts to be heavy straight saplings of the best description of hardwood, with the bark removed, not less than nine (9) inches in diameter at the butt, and five (5) inches in diameter at the top, and twenty-five (25) feet in length; to be carefully and thoroughly charred from the base upwards over a space of six (6) feet, and well coated with the best coal tar, the top to be firmly bound at one (1) inch from its extremity with good hoop iron, not less than one (1) inch wide; a hole of proper size to receive the insulating pin, to be bored into the centre of the top of the posts to the depth of five and a-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) inches.

The posts to be not more than eighty-eight (88) yards apart, unless by special permission, to be sunk five (5) feet in the ground and well rammed, and placed in a perpendicular position.

No spotted gum, or Moreton Bay ash will be allowed for posts. At angles, or other places where required, struts or supports of wood, fixed as directed, to be supplied.

All trees and underwood standing within thirty (30) feet on each side of the line, the course of which will be marked out, to be cut down, in addition to which all trees and branches beyond that limit, which, in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer, may endanger or be likely to endanger the line, to be removed. The fallen timber will be allowed to remain on the line, but twenty (20) feet must be thoroughly cleared and removed around each post.

All roads and tracks which may become blocked by fallen trees must be cleared by the removal of timber to the original width of such roadway or track.

WHEREAS it is very important that the Annual Statistical Register of Queensland should be laid before the Colonial Parliament at its meeting in the month of April in each year: His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified to all Heads of Departments, Officers of the Police Force, and other Civil Servants of Government, that the Returns required from them by the Registrar-General, for the purpose of enabling him to compile the Statistics, must be forwarded to the Registrar-General's Office, correctly and fully filled up with the necessary information, on or before the 1st day of February in each year.

The Registrar-General has been directed to report to the Government the names of all officers who may fail to comply with this notification, and, in accordance with the 256th Article of the Queen's Colonial Regulations, the payment of the salary of every such officer shall be suspended, until he shall have forwarded the Returns required from him, or shall have shown sufficient grounds for his delay.

Getting around this CD

NAVIGATING ARCHIVE CD BOOKS CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

SEARCHING TEXT ON ARCHIVE CD BOOKS AUSTRALIA CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched.

The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

DIFFERENT VERSIONS OF ADOBE ACROBAT READER

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a "Find" and a "Search" tool. Those tools are two **totally** different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **FIND** tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a "Find" tool (not a "search" tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **FIND** tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a "Search" tool (not a tool labelled "Find")
HOWEVER — what is called "Search" is the same as the tool that used to be called "Find" Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **SEARCH** tool

TIPS FOR SEARCHING AND GETTING MORE FROM THE CD BOOKS

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering "rederi" if you want "Frederick", but find that the letters "F" "c" and "k" are sometimes misread.
- use the "Match whole word" option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith
- use the "Match case" option when you want to eliminate all the occupations "smith" if you only want the name "Smith"
- Don't just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
 - look for others of the same name
 - look for others who lived in the same place or street
 - who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
 - how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
 - what churches were there and what time were services held?
 - what other activities were there in the community?
 - look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- All of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You could learn or write much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
