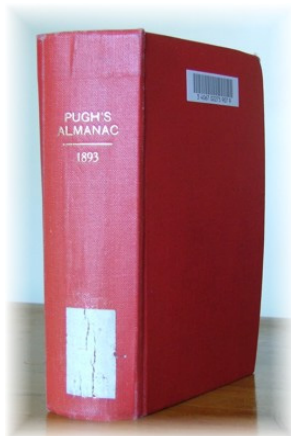

## THE COLONY OF QUEENSLAND.

NOTE.—For fuller description of the Colony of Queensland, see Pugh's Almanac for 1890. The figures given herein are from the latest official returns.

AUSTRALIA was discovered by Captain Cook in the year 1770. In the year 1859 this portion was proclaimed an independent colony under the name of Queensland, and Sir George Ferguson Bowen was appointed first Governor. He arrived on December 10 in the same year. The population in the year 1859 was nearly 25,000. In 1860 the first official returns gave the number as 28,056; the census returns for 1880 gave 190,344 males, 132,569 females, making a total of 322,953 persons. The number in the colony on December 31, 1891, was estimated at 232,558 males, 177,772 females; total, 410,330 persons. The total population of the colony according to the May census of 1891 was 393,718 persons, consisting of 223,779 males and 169,939 females.

Queensland is divided into twelve districts, as follows:—Cook, Kennedy (North and South), Leichhardt, Gregory (South and West), Mitchell, Burke, Port Curtis, Burnett, Moreton (East and West), Darling Downs, Maranoa, Warrego.

**MINING.**—*Coal.*—The Queensland coal deposits are both numerous and extensive. The principal fields are at Ipswich; also in the Wide Bay District. In 1891 the total quantity of coal raised was 271,603 tons, of the total value of £128,198. This was a decrease of 66,741 tons on the preceding year and decreased value of £28,879.

*Iron* in Queensland is very plentiful, and exists in nearly every district.

*Gold.*—The goldfields of Queensland are among the richest assets of the colony and are classified into the Northern, Central and Southern Divisions. There are eleven working fields included in the Northern Division; of these Charters Towers and Cape River produced in 1891 223,403 ozs., an increase of 59,381 ozs. upon the quantity recorded in the previous year. The return from Croydon for 1891 was 65,892 ozs., being an increase over the previous year of 5,524 ozs. The Etheridge and Woolgar produced 17,908 ozs., being a decrease of 6,672 ozs. Ravenswood 13,427 ozs., a decrease of 2,626 ozs. The Palmer produced 12,721 ozs., being an increase of 2,032 ozs. Hodgkinson returns 655 ozs., a decrease of 427 ozs. Cloncurry and district 23,296 ozs., an increase of 10,042 ozs. The Central District comprises three goldfields, the principal of which is Rockhampton, which heads the list with 147,691 ozs., being a decrease of 78,559 ozs. In the Southern Division, Gympie is the principal auriferous locality; the yield from it in 1891 was 60,714 ozs., being a decrease of 17,652 ozs. Eidsvold produced 10,732 ozs., a decrease of 5,201 ozs. The following shows the estimated yields of gold in the principal fields of the colony to the end of 1891:—Palmer, 1,328,867 ozs.; Ravenswood, 383,080 ozs.; Charters Towers and Cape River, 2,302,476 ozs.; Hodgkinson and Mulgrave, 224,075 ozs.; Etheridge and Woolgar, 426,999 ozs.; Gympie, 1,685,269 ozs.; Rockhampton, 992,553 ozs.; Croydon, 257,595 ozs.; Cloncurry and other fields, 364,732 ozs.; Eidsvold, 49,268 ozs.;—total, 8,014,914 ozs., which at £3 10s. per oz., would be £28,052,199. In 1891, 9,190 miners' rights were issued, being an increase of 217; and 193 business licenses, a decrease of 27.

*Tin.*—Stanthorpe, on the Southern border, was for some years the principal tin-producing district in Queensland. Tin is still found here but in greatly diminished quantities. At present the principal tin-producing country is in the North. The Wild River District, where there are many mines opened, is extremely rich in this valuable metal. During 1891 the total quantity of tin raised in Queensland was 2,236 tons, valued at £116,387—a decrease of 734 tons, value £26,879.

*Copper.*—The principal copper-fields are at Peak Downs, Mount Perry, and Cloncurry. In 1891 there were 98 tons of copper raised, of the value of £865—a decrease of 87 tons, value £1,235.

## Queensland "Men of the Time."

**ALAND, ROBERT, M.L.A.**, for Drayton, and Toowoomba, was born at Clapton, near London, on December 24, 1836. Was educated in London, leaving school at an early age. He arrived in Sydney in 1853, and in Brisbane two years later. For several years he was an alderman of Toowoomba, twice filling the mayoral chair. He is connected with most of the local institutions. He offered himself as a candidate for the electorate in 1878, but was defeated. In 1881 he was elected; also at the general election in October, 1885, and again at the general election of 1888.

**ALLAN, WILLIAM, M.L.A., F.R.G.S.**, was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, and educated at Oliphant's School, Edinburgh, afterwards at Dunbar, and later attended classes at the Andersonian University, Glasgow. Mr. Allan has followed squatting pursuits ever since he arrived in the colonies, first in Riverina, Murrumbidgee, and Lachlan Districts, N.S.W.; thereafter in the Maranoa and Darling Downs districts of Queensland. Mr. Allan came to Queensland and purchased properties in 1874. Visited Europe in 1875. Entered Parliament as one of the members for Darling Downs in 1881, and again for the same constituency in 1887. In 1888 he was elected for the new constituency of Cunningham. Mr. Allan, while in London in 1884, was elected Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society. He takes an interest in pastoral, agricultural, and other societies, and has acted on the committees of the National Society, Royal Agricultural Society, and as president of the Eastern Downs P. & A. Association. He has travelled much on the continents of Europe and America; also, in Egypt, India, Java, &c.

**ALMOND, CAPTAIN T. M., F.R.A.S.,** Portmaster, was born at Scarborough, Yorkshire, in August, 1836, and was educated at the Royal Naval School, Greenwich, where he remained four years, and at once began life in the mercantile marine, and with such success that he passed his examination and was made chief officer of a large vessel at the age of 21, and passed as master at the early age of 22 years; with Extra Master's Certificate at 25. He traded to Australia for many years, and first came to Queensland in command of the barque *Alfred Hawley*. For eleven years Captain Almond was a recognised observer for the Meteorological Department of the Board of Trade, and has been the recipient of gratifying testimonials to the excellence of his work; he was subsequently appointed the agent for the Council in London. He has received, for saving life, a gold medal from the Shipwrecked Mariners' and Fishermen's Society of London; a gold medal from the Shipwrecked Mariners' and Humane Society of London, and a silver medal from the Board of Trade. Captain Almond is also a younger brother of Trinity House. In February, 1881, he was appointed Despatching Officer in connection with the Immigration Department, and held that position until he was appointed to his present office in April, 1890.

**ANDERSON, JOHN GERARD, M.A., J.P.,** Under Secretary for Education, is a son of the

late Rev. James Anderson, M.A., Minister of Orphir, Orkney, and was born on February 12th, 1836, and educated at the University of Aberdeen, where he graduated in the degree of Master of Arts. He subsequently continued his studies at the same University as a student of Divinity. He landed in Queensland in 1862, and was appointed first District Inspector of Schools in September, 1863, since which time his connection with the Education Service has been uninterrupted. Mr. Anderson was appointed Senior Inspector in June, 1869; Acting General Inspector in September, 1874; General Inspector in 1876, and Under Secretary in November, 1878. He was a member of the University Royal Commission of 1891.

**ANNEN, JOHN THOMAS, M.L.A.**, was born at Budock, Penryn, Cornwall, England, on June 8rd, 1842, and was educated at the Church of England Denominational School at Budock. He arrived in Queensland in 1863, and settled in Ipswich, where he carried on contracting until 1867, when he went to Maryborough, where he was successful in obtaining the contracts for many of the important buildings including the new Public Offices and the State School. He is now a member of the firm of J. T. Annear & Co., railway contractors, who carried out the Maryborough and Gympie Railway. Mr. Annear was an alderman of Maryborough for fourteen years, and served as Mayor for a year. He has represented Maryborough for some years and was again elected at the election of 1888. In 1889 Mr. Annear visited England and America.

**APLIN, HON. WM., M.L.C.**, a member of the firm of Aplin, Brown, & Co., Limited, merchants, Townsville, was born at Combe, St. Nicholas, Somerset, England, 27th April, 1840. Educated at Bourton Academy, Dorsetshire; arrived in Brisbane at the end of 1862. Left for what was then the most northern settlement (Bowen), 1863. Commenced business at Townsville on its opening, in June, 1865, and was successfully engaged in mercantile pursuits in that town till 1881. He then engaged in pastoral pursuits, having purchased from Mr. Robert Stewart his Southwick Station, in the North Kennedy District. Was a member of the first Municipal Council, Townsville, and twice Mayor of that town. Was a member of two Divisional Boards (Thuringowa and Dalrymple), and chairman of the former for the first two years of its existence; is president of the North Queensland Pastoral Association; and also of the Townsville Turf Club. He also holds many other public positions and appointments. Was appointed to a seat in the Legislative Council on October 19, 1880.

**ARCHER, ARCHIBALD, M.L.A.**, born at Fife, Scotland, 13th March, 1820, and was educated in Norway. Returning to Scotland he was engaged for five years in an engineering establishment. Arrived in Australia in 1842, but left after a short stay, and spent thirteen years in the South Sea and Sandwich Islands, and at the latter was engaged on sugar and coffee plantations. Returned to Queensland in 1860 and took up his residence at the family estate of Gracemere. Was elected to Parliament as member for Rock-

## City of Brisbane Directory.

THE City of Brisbane is situated on the river of the same name, about 20 miles (less in a direct line) from its mouth. It lies about 58 feet above sea level in 27° 28' 3" south latitude, and 153° 6' 15" east longitude. It is, for municipal purposes, divided into five wards—East, West, North, Valley, and Kangaroo Point, each of which returns two aldermen, presided over by a mayor elected by the aldermen. It returns six members to the Legislative Assembly—two each for the electorates of North Brisbane, South Brisbane, and Fortitude Valley. The population of the city and suburbs within a radius of five miles of the post-office by the census of 1891 was 93,657. Mileage of streets, 52½ miles. Capital value of rateable property for 1892, £7,898,650. Vessels of nearly the largest size afloat can be brought up to the Brisbane wharves.

# Getting around this CD

## NAVIGATING ARCHIVE CD BOOKS CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

## SEARCHING TEXT ON ARCHIVE CD BOOKS AUSTRALIA CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched.

The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances  
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

## DIFFERENT VERSIONS OF ADOBE ACROBAT READER

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a "Find" and a "Search" tool. Those tools are two \*totally\* different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the \*FIND\* tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a "Find" tool (not a "search" tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the \*FIND\* tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a "Search" tool (not a tool labelled "Find")  
HOWEVER — what is called "Search" is the same as the tool that used to be called "Find" Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the \*SEARCH\* tool

## TIPS FOR SEARCHING AND GETTING MORE FROM THE CD BOOKS

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering "rederi" if you want "Frederick", but find that the letters "F" "c" and "k" are sometimes misread.
- use the "Match whole word" option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith
- use the "Match case" option when you want to eliminate all the occupations "smith" if you only want the name "Smith"
- Don't just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
  - look for others of the same name
  - look for others who lived in the same place or street
  - who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
  - how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
  - what churches were there and what time were services held?
  - what other activities were there in the community?
  - look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- All of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You could learn or write much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
