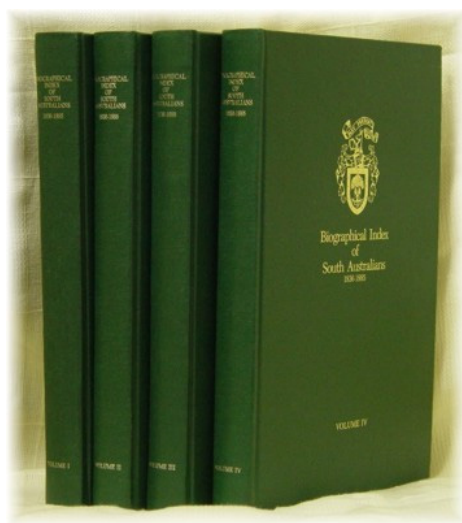

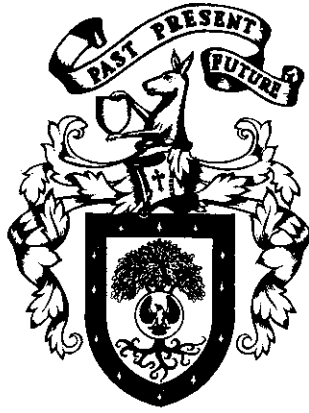

Preface

The Biographical Index of South Australians was conceived by the South Australian Genealogy and Heraldry Society Inc. Planning commenced in August 1980 when it was decided to support the Project as its contribution to South Australia's Sesquicentenary—Jubilee 150 Year.

The objectives of the Project were three-fold;

to collect biographical detail of all people who lived in South Australia during the first fifty years of colonisation;

to give as many people as possible the opportunity to participate in the preparation;

to provide a valuable permanent record for future South Australian historians and biographers.

The Society with a proven record of volunteer labour, enthusiasm, financial support and careful management, felt confident that this enormous Project could be accomplished. This confidence was not misplaced and our painstaking efforts have not been in vain.

The publication of the first four volumes of the Biographical Index is the culmination of over five years' concentrated work.

Using the extensive resources of the Genealogy Society Library, including the transcriptions of over 550 South Australian cemeteries, archival material and published works, we extracted and collated entries comprising over 500,000 names of men, women and children. In addition, many individuals submitted material.

Basic biographical detail has been adhered to, to allow a more exhaustive coverage and keep within an acceptable size and price range.

This last fact indeed has been the basis of the planning, so that the average citizen could own a set of the Index for future research.

Although based on a similar Index produced in Western Australia, this publication differs by the extensive search of public and private sources as well as the manual collation of data by over 2,000 volunteers.

Computerisation of this data has enabled the storage, manipulation and printing processes to be facilitated and makes South Australia the first State to computerise genealogical records, surely a fitting landmark in our Jubilee Year.

It is recognised that the task is not complete. Omissions are intended to be included in further volumes to be published in 1988. Information for inclusion in these volumes will be accepted from the public until 31st October 1986.

Although not an exhaustive work, the present volumes give the most comprehensive picture to date of nineteenth century South Australians. No similar text exists.

Every effort has been made also to ensure the accuracy of the publication. Cross checking has eliminated discrepancies and a great many errors have been corrected, but the Index remains only as accurate as the information provided by individuals or gleaned from written records.

No responsibility for incorrect information is accepted as the policy throughout has been to accept, without question, a private submission.

Whenever contradictory information necessitated further research, we accepted the private submission unconditionally, unless proof was obtained.

You are invited to notify the Society of inaccuracies or additions to entries, but it must be stressed that all details submitted for publication should be accompanied by appropriate sources and received by 31st October 1986.

Thanks must go to all those who participated, especially the small nucleus of regular volunteers who each made a considerable contribution to the compilation of the Index.

I consider it to be a truly remarkable volunteer effort, and one of which I am justly proud.

Introductory Notes

This Introduction is provided to assist the reader make the most use of the "Biographical Index of South Australians, 1836-1885", and it is recommended that it is read before information contained within these volumes is used in their research.

It is the first comprehensive index of the people of South Australia who lived in the Colony during the first fifty years of settlement.

For the purpose of this Index South Australia includes the Northern Territory which until 1911 was politically and administratively part of South Australia.

Details are given of where the information is derived and how it has been presented.

Although the information is largely of the European population in South Australia, every effort has been made to include details of non-European residents.

It comprises biographical details of 107,875 entries, arranged alphabetically, with associated detail for 79,132 spouses and 248,015 children and includes (in volume IV) a Cross Reference listing of 48,980 former or maiden surnames.

Although some entries have been compiled from a single source, most have been collated from information extracted from various sources.

A complete entry could contain the following detail:—

It should be noted that the information is printed continuously within an entry.

Each child is separated by a comma.

Only details provided are prefixed as above.

SORTING SEQUENCE for Text and Cross Reference.

Entries are sorted and printed in strict alphabetical order, irrespective of whether upper or lower case characters,

eg. MacDONALD sorted as MAC-DONALD

McDONALD sorted as MCDONALD

Where brackets are used to denote variations in spelling, a name will appear at its fullest form,

eg. CRA(C)KER sorted as CRACKER
CRA(I)NE sorted as CRAINE

Titled people will be sorted under their title, within a Surname,

eg. CRABB Henry
CRABB Hon George
CRABB James
CRABB Mrs Elizabeth
CRABB Thomas

For use of Titles see NAMES - Titles.

CROSS REFERENCE LISTING of Former or Maiden Surname of Spouse to Entry Surname.

This appears in strict alphabetical sequence in Volume IV, with all parts of the name being in upper case,

eg. DE LA PAGE
VON STANKE etc.

Where the same combination of names occurs more than once, as with two sisters marrying two brothers, only one is listed, with no indication of how many such combinations exist in the text.

There are 2,144 such duplicated combinations.

SCOPE OF INFORMATION

The period 1836-1885 inclusive was selected because the bulk of immigration was during this time and it was thus a significant period in the establishment and growth of the State.

Indexing is by adult male with associated details of wife and family. Adult women

have also been included provided they lived independently of Father, Husband or Brother - an adult being defined as over 15 years of age.

A statistical analysis was made to determine the number of adults eligible for inclusion, ie. those who had lived or were living in the Colony of South Australia during the period 1836-1885.

From the 1881 Census, the male population aged 15+ was found to be 63.5% of the total male population. Using the same percentage for the male population in 1886 and adding to it

- deaths for the period
- emigration out of the Colony
- eligible females (calculated at 2%)

we found that approximately 163,000 people were eligible for inclusion in the Index.

Note: In addition to the 107,875 entries printed in this 4 volume set a further 50,000 entries are planned to be published in 1988.

SOURCES

Information was sought from all readily accessible public, published and private records.

Only sources which yielded the maximum amount of biographical detail were examined. These are as follows:-

- Ships' passenger records
- Destitute Asylum records
- 1841 Census (the only extant Census record)
- Adelaide Hospital Admission records
- Cemetery burial records & headstone inscriptions
- Church records (Baptisms, Marriages & Burials)
- Probates, Wills and Letters of Administration
- Matrimonial Petitions
- Pedigree Charts (held by the Society)
- Almanacs & Directories
- Police Gazettes
- Education Gazettes
- Published family histories
- Published biographical histories
- Published district/local histories
- Newspaper obituaries
- A number of newspaper indexes
- Private submissions (from the general public)

A significant proportion of entries received were private submissions.

The total number of private submissions exceeded 130,000 entries.

However, approx. 30% of these were duplicated, ie. for the same family, and only approx. 20% of the total were sufficiently complete to warrant publication without further research.

Hence the majority of entries have been collated relying heavily upon extracted sources and further research details such as Birth, Death & Marriage Indexes.

EXPLANATION OF DATA

1. NAMES

All surnames are in capitals.

Given names and surnames have been used throughout the text as provided. Only where several variations of the same name have been extracted from sources have we endeavoured to standardise names. Hence, Francis (f) and Frances (m) may occur throughout.

Abbreviations have been used extensively, especially where dual names occur. A list of ABBREVIATIONS follows these notes.

Titles Only Sir, Hon and Mrs have been attributed as part of the given name. This has meant that these entries are found out of order of their given name, under S, H or M. All other ranks and titles have been omitted. Miss and Mrs have been used when no given name is known.

Initials are assumed male, unless otherwise stated.

eg. H.G. = male
J.M. (f) = female

Variations in Spelling

With the aid of brackets we have shown variations in spelling where there is no indication of which is correct.

eg. EAT(T)S or (O')DONNELL

These are to be read as EATS/EATTS and DONNELL/O'DONNELL.

Cross reference entries have been included where the variation is not obvious,

eg. SULWAY Louis
see Louis JAMES

Irish or Scottish names with/without O' or Mc/Mac generally have not been cross referenced and both sections of the alphabet should be consulted for some surnames.

Nicknames or a common name have been included provided they are dissimilar to the given name. These usually appear in brackets after the given name,

eg. Frances (Trixie)
Jane (Sr Mary Rose)
Carl Ernst Hermann (Henry Ernest)

Inconsistencies occur when general rules are obeyed.

We have used entry name and spouse details uniformly irrespective of whether male or female. Thus a male spouse will be described as "nee" (female form).

So that the Cross Reference listing of spouse's maiden or former surname to entry surname (see volume IV) is not rendered useless when the entry is a female, we have included her maiden name with her married surname,

eg. entry name: SMITH (nee
BOWERING) Mrs
Jane
spouse: John SMITH

Thus the Cross Reference listing will appear as:-

SMITH - SMITH (NEE BOWERING)

It should be noted that where this occurs it is not a SMITH - SMITH marriage you are seeking, but rather a SMITH - BOWERING marriage or union.

Maiden names are in capital letters preceded by "nee".

In some instances it has been impossible to determine whether a spouse's surname is her maiden or married surname. If no corroborative evidence was provided we omitted the maiden name.

Changes of name

Explanations for changes of name are not included. Whilst most changes of names were to anglicise a foreign name, some were changed to an entirely different name,

eg. SCHNEIDER see TAYLOR

Aliases

An alias is included where applicable.

2. DATES

Dates are generally represented as "21.3.1873". However, when incomplete they may occur as:-

Mar.1873
21.?.1873
21.3.187?
or 21.3.18?

Approximations are derived from the ages of the individual at baptism, marriage, death/burial, arrival etc. Where variations occur we have accepted the earliest date, unless an error is indicated.

These are represented as c1873
1870s
or by 1874

Death: "after 1900" means that the individual was alive in 1900.

3. ENTRY NAME

Printed in bold type is the surname, maiden name, title, given name, nickname and unmarried status of the entry, where applicable.

Exceptions

Aborigines often have only one name.

Chinese names have occasionally been reversed, but have been reported as found.

4. PARENTS

Given names of father and mother including the mother's former and/or maiden surnames are provided where known,

eg. Heinrich Whm and Anna Rosina fmlly
KURSCHNER nee HEINKE

The father's surname is not repeated unless different to that of the entry or spouse.

Foundlings are given as "(orphan)".

Step or adoptive parents are included in the absence of natural parents.

5. BIRTH

Dates and places of birth or baptism are stated.

Born "at sea" = aboard the ship by which he/she arrived.

Born "aboard **THETIS**" suggests the ship **THETIS** was already in port.

6. DEATH

Places of Death and dates of Death or Burial/ Cremation are given.

Died "by 1849" = by 31st December 1849.

Died "at sea" = aboard the ship by which he/she would have arrived in South Australia.

Died "aboard
STAG" = aboard the **STAG** on a trip other than his/her 1st arrival in the Colony.

Died "R Murray
SA" = drowned in the River.

Died "off
ADMELLA" = drowned off the wreck or ship **ADMELLA**.

7. PLACE OF BURIAL

Cemeteries have only been included if different to the place of death. A spouse's cemetery is only included if different to that of the entry.

Generally the town or suburb has been used to describe a cemetery, and not the church or property name.

To avoid confusion with towns of similar names we have standardised some cemeteries in South Australia,

eg. Happy Valley cemetery near Pt Lincoln is given as Pt Lincoln SA, whilst Stirling North cemetery near Pt Augusta is given as Pt Augusta SA.

Brighton SA and Nth Brighton SA are different cemeteries and have been stated accordingly.

Note: West Terrace Cemetery, Adelaide (WTC), with approximately 200,000 burials, is the largest cemetery in South Australia.

8. ARRIVAL

It should be stressed that the arrival relates only to the entry's arrival to South Australia whether by ship or overland from other Australian colonies. For spouse, see 14. OTHER INFORMATION.

Where only a date appears, the means by which the Entry arrived is unknown. Approximate dates have been derived through extracted information and may be stated as "by 1849" or "c1850" or "after 1854", unless this is obvious from other information printed.

For example, if "m: 21.1.1854 Adelaide SA" is the earliest mention of an entry, we have omitted the approximated arrival.

Multiple arrivals are numbered accordingly, eg. 1836 BUFFALO (2) 1851 THETIS (3) 1885 HOLMSDALE

When it is unclear whether an individual was born in the Colony or at sea and no record of birth registration exists, we have given the arrival as:-

arr: 1854 EMIGRANT / b. SA

9. OCCUPATION

We have endeavoured to list only the main occupations attained by the entry in South Australia.

Where numerous occupations have been held we have chosen three "and others". An attempt has been made to standardise some occupations.

Minister has been used for Minister of Religion, and **Doctor** in lieu of Medical Practitioner, unless known to have been a specialist eg. Bishop or Surgeon.

Mining Captain has been differentiated from **Sea Captain**.

Policeman has been designated as such, irrespective of rank or type. Note: Many joined the Police Force for only a few weeks or months.

Agricultural Labourer has been taken directly from ships' passenger lists and used unless later occupations have been found and substituted.

Gentleman has been used for a man of means in the absence of any other recognised occupation.

Housewife, washerwoman, midwife and seamstress have been omitted unless seen to be the major supporting occupation.

Ambiguous Information.

Hawker - in some circumstances it is uncertain whether this refers to an occupation or residence.

Farmer - some have found to be incorrectly registered as a surname in lieu of an occupation.

We have endeavoured to correct inaccuracies, but often are unaware of them unless extensive research into the family has been attempted. Regrettably this has not been possible in most cases.

10. RESIDENCE

As for occupations, we have listed only the main residences or included three "and others".

Only towns or suburbs relating to South Australia and Northern Territory are included.

Property names have been used in the absence of specific locations.

Some areas or districts have been given when the entry has lived in a variety of towns in that area or district,

eg. "Yorke Pen".

11. RELIGION

Many entries have been labelled C/E, especially those early pioneers whose marriages and baptisms were performed at Holy Trinity Church, Adelaide.

Moreover, we have attributed a particular religion to an entry when information has been extracted from denominational records. Thus the religion should be taken as an indication of where baptisms, marriages and burials are recorded rather than any particular religious persuasion.

12. MARRIAGE

Dates and places of marriage are given.

Marriage bann dates have been included in the absence of an actual marriage date, usually c20.1.1850 or cJan.1850.

Married "by 1860" generally indicates that the couple arrived married and without children.

Where religious and civil services have been performed for the same union, we have accepted the earlier date.

An asterisk (*) occurring after a date denotes one party only is listed in the Marriage Indexes.

De facto relationships and other unions have been treated as if married, although no marriage details will be included. If no children are involved, ie. they have not assumed their natural father's surname, we have omitted reference to any extra marital union. **Unmarried** males have "(unm)" included after their given name, provided they died having never married.

Females are only included if they are unmarried, widowed or their husband's name is unknown. Therefore single women are easily identified by the absence of the title "Mrs".

13. SPOUSE

As previously recognised (see NAMES) a spouse can be the wife or husband of an entry.

Details pertinent only to the spouse follow the given and/or surnames.

Where a spouse's name is unknown, it is stated accordingly.

Widows' former and maiden surnames are given when known.

eg. Mrs Jane Eliz CORDEN nee BLIGGS

14. OTHER INFORMATION

This relates only to the spouse and will contain detail, generally prefixed as "*arr: occ: res: rel:*" etc. which differs from that of the entry.

Arrival details of a spouse are not included when she arrived with her parents.

15. CHILDREN

Children are included in chronological order of birth with their years of birth and death enclosed in brackets and separated by a dash (-).

Where there is no indication of order, children whose dates are known will precede others. If a child whose dates are known is listed last of others unknown, then it may be taken that this child was the youngest.

Children of previous unions are generally listed first.

Stillborn births have been omitted, except where a child bears a name or is one of a twin.

Ages of children at death can be shown as "d.(21)" - the number contained within the brackets denotes the age in years.

States, countries, WW1 or WW2 have often been substituted for unknown death years, to assist in further research.

Twins and triplets have been stated accordingly.

Titles have been used where applicable. However, "Mrs" will only appear when a given name is unknown.

Surnames of children are omitted unless different from that of the entry. Birth surnames are preceded by "nee", irrespective of whether male or female.

eg. Fried Whm nee SCHLENKER

Married surnames of daughters have been included. Where more than one marriage has occurred, each married surname is quoted in order of occurrence.

If a daughter has married two men of the same surname, it is not repeated,

eg. Augte Emma nee SCHLENKER,
MATSCHOSS

Where there are **no children** of the union we have included "no issue".

Ambiguities may occur when entries are listed as:-

ch: no issue

(adopted) Jane nee SMITH

This shows that although there were no children of the union the couple did adopt/foster.

Births of children some years before/after a marriage have been checked for error whenever possible. Where there is no proof an error has occurred we have included the information as provided.

Adoption

Legal adoption was not introduced in South Australia until 1925 but the term (adopted) has been used when provided by private submissions and other records.

USE OF ASTERISK AND QUERY MARK

The query mark (^p) is used to denote indefinite or doubtful detail. This usually originates from a private submission.

The asterisk (*) is used when we have collated information but have no definite proof that it belongs to the entry. This has allowed us to use far more information, and thus facilitate further research, than would otherwise have been possible within the confines of eligibility.

As the reader will readily recognise from the above Introductory Notes every effort has been made to ensure the highest degree of accuracy of detail. Inevitably errors and omissions will occur and it is recommended that researchers use this as a tool for their research and are encouraged to verify the information.

Getting around this CD

Navigating Archive CD Books CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

Searching Text on Archive CD Books Australia CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched. The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

Different Versions of Adobe Acrobat Reader

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a “Find” and a “Search” tool. Those tools are two **totally** different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **FIND** tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a “Find” tool (not a “search” tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **FIND** tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a “Search” tool (not a tool labelled “Find”). HOWEVER — what is called “Search” is the same as the tool that used to be called “Find” Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **SEARCH** tool

Tips For Searching and Getting More From the CD Books

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering “rederi” if you want “Frederick”, but find that the letters “F” “c” and “k” are sometimes misread.
- use the “Match whole word” option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith.
- use the “Match case” option to eliminate all the occupations “smith” if you only want the name “Smith”.
- don’t just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
 - › look for others of the same name
 - › look for others who lived in the same place or street
 - › who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
 - › how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
 - › what churches were there and what time were services held?
 - › what other activities were there in the community?
 - › look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- all of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You can learn much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
- Many CDs have only one file, but some have the book content spread over several files. Adobe Reader normally searches in the file that is open at the time. If you wish to search ALL files at once choose the “All PDF documents in” option and select the CD drive or directory the files are in—Adobe Reader 6 only.
