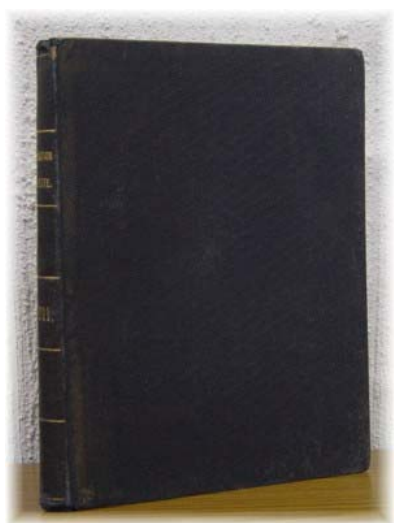

OFFICIAL LIST OF SCHOOLS FOR 1911.

The following list of schools shows average attendance, classification of schools under Regulation 291, the number examined, and the classification under Regulation 183. It also gives the names and positions of Head, Assistant, and Provisional Teachers for 1911, their personal classification, and their present salaries.

EXPLANATION OF SIGNS.

The following abbreviations have been used:—H.M. for head master, H.T. for head teacher, H.M. for head mistress, I.M. for infant mistress, Ch.A. for chief assistant, Ch.I.A. for chief assistant in charge of infants, A. for assistant, A.A. for acting assistant, Pr.A. for provisional assistant, Temp. A. for temporary assistant, A. in C. for assistant in charge, L.T. for *locum tenens*, V.S. for village settlement.

An asterisk (*) before the name of a school shows that the building is not the property of the Department.

A dagger (†) before the name of a school shows that no residence is provided.

The mark (T) before the name of a school shows a building erected by the residents, and partly paid for by the Government.

The mark (§) after the name of a school shows that it has been opened since January, 1910.

In the examination classification column, A corresponds with the Inspector's mark "Excellent," B with "Very Good," C with "Good," D with "Very Fair," E with "Fair," F with "Moderate," an asterisk less than "Moderate." A dash shows that either no examination was held or that it was only for the purpose of classifying the pupils.

CARE OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS.

The Hon. Minister of Education directs that the attention of all teachers occupying residences the property of the Department shall be called to the following instructions :—

1. It is their duty to keep the guttering and spouting of such residences free from all obstructions, and to report immediately to the Chairman of the Board of Advice if any repairs are necessary.
2. In the case of schoolrooms, it is expected that teachers will attend to the spouting and keep it clear and free from rubbish. Should the work be beyond their powers, they are required to report at once to the Chairman of the Board of Advice in writing.

Should damage result from their neglect in carrying out these instructions, the teachers will be held responsible.

PROTECTION OF NATIVE BIRDS.

Owing to the continued and ruthless destruction of many of our handsome native birds, united action between England and her dependencies has been taken to secure such legislation as will tend to prevent the killing, exportation, and sale of all protected birds, either living or dead.

The authorities recognize that in order to make such legislation effective, it is necessary to educate the people in both town and country to understand the real value and usefulness of our native birds.

A beginning has been made in South Australia by the issue from the Intelligence Department of a book containing illustrations of those birds that are protected during the whole of the year.

Owing to the kindness of the Crown Lands Department, the Director of Education will be able to place a copy of this book, together with two wall plates of the illustrations, in each school for the help and guidance of teachers and scholars in this branch of Nature Study.

At present the number of books available is limited, and copies can be presented only to those schools that have entered into the spirit of the movement by forming a school Bird Protection Club.

The book and wall plates that are to follow in due time will appear on the stock sheets with other departmental publications. Copies of the book will be forwarded to schools in the order in which notice of the formation of school Bird Protection Clubs is received by Mr. Edquist at the High School.

It is hoped that teachers will avail themselves fully of the opportunity now given them to foster in their pupils the love for bird life and the spirit of bird protection.

TEACHERS AND THE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS.

It may not be generally known that the University authorities will allow teachers to enter for the Public and Degree examinations free of charge if their entry forms are first sent to the Director of Education for endorsement.

Monitors who have been registered as candidates for pupil teachership for twelve months, and provisional teachers, may enter for the full number of subjects in the Junior Public examination, or for enough to complete their certificates with the addition of those subjects already passed.

The subjects for the Senior and Higher Public and the Degree examinations may be taken separately.

Pupil teachers make their entries through the head master of the High School or the Principal of the University Training College.

Entries will not be franked for, nor will teachers be allowed leave of absence to attend, the Special Senior Public Examination in March unless the circumstances are very exceptional.

Any teacher who desires to take up a subject in the Degree course, to attend lectures and to sit for the examination, should forward an application to the Director.

A teacher who finds it necessary to apply for exemption from lectures must communicate with the Registrar of the University through the Director. This must be done within a fortnight after the beginning of the session or term.

Persons who have already received permission to sit for examination in any particular subject, and who failed to pass the examination, do not need to apply (in a subsequent year) for exemption from lectures on that same subject.

Persons who obtained exemption, but did not present themselves for examination, must renew their applications for exemption.

It is not necessary to apply for exemption for a subject in which no lectures are being given during the year.

Getting around this CD

Navigating Archive CD Books CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

Searching Text on Archive CD Books Australia CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched. The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

Different Versions of Adobe Acrobat Reader

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a “Find” and a “Search” tool. Those tools are two *totally* different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *FIND* tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a “Find” tool (not a “search” tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *FIND* tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a “Search” tool (not a tool labelled “Find”). HOWEVER — what is called “Search” is the same as the tool that used to be called “Find” Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *SEARCH* tool

Tips For Searching and Getting More From the CD Books

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering “rederi” if you want “Frederick”, but find that the letters “F” “c” and “k” are sometimes misread.
- use the “Match whole word” option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith.
- use the “Match case” option to eliminate all the occupations “smith” if you only want the name “Smith”.
- don’t just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
 - › look for others of the same name
 - › look for others who lived in the same place or street
 - › who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
 - › how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
 - › what churches were there and what time were services held?
 - › what other activities were there in the community?
 - › look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- all of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You can learn much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
- Many CDs have only one file, but some have the book content spread over several files. Adobe Reader normally searches in the file that is open at the time. If you wish to search ALL files at once choose the "All PDF documents in" option and select the CD drive or directory the files are in—Adobe Reader 6 only.
