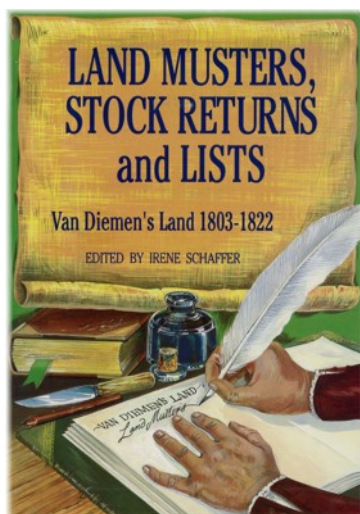

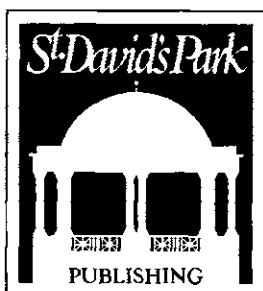

GOVERNMENT HOUSE, HOBART TOWN,
Saturday, August 15th, 1818.

A General Muster of the whole of the Inhabitants (Civil Officers and Military excepted) will take place at the different settlements on the Days herein-after-named, under the Inspection of HIS HONOR the LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, assisted by Mr. Acting Deputy Assistant Commissary General ARCHER, and A. W. H. HUMPHREY, Esq. Justice of Peace.

At the Secretary's Office, Hobart Town, on Monday and Tuesday September 7th and 8th; all the Free Men of every Description on and off the Stores, residing in Hobart Town and adjacent Districts on this side of the River and North-west Bay downwards, and New Town and its Environs as far as the Black Snake upwards.

On Wednesday, September 9th, all the Free Women of every Description on and off the Stores in the same Districts.

On Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 10th, 11th, and 12th, all the Male Prisoners on and off the Stores in the same Districts, including Ticket of Leave Men.

On Monday and Tuesday, September 14th and 15th, all the Female Prisoners on and off the Stores in the same Districts.

At Kimberley's, Clarence Plains, on Wednesday, September 16th, the whole of every Description of Free Men and Women on and off the Stores, and of all Male and Female Prisoners on and off the Stores in Clarence Plains, the Lagoon District, and District of Kangaroo Point.

At B. Reardon's, Pitt Water, on Friday, September 18th, the whole of every Description of Free Men and Women on and off the Stores, in the District of Pitt Water, with New Plains, and the Carleton.

On Saturday, September 19th, all the Male and Female Prisoners, Tickets of Leave included, within the said Districts.

At Colonel Davey's, Coal River, on Monday, September 21st, the whole of every Description of Free Men and Women on and off the Stores, and all Male and Female Prisoners, Tickets of Leave included, on and off the Stores, in the Districts of the Coal River, the Duck Holes, &c.

At Herdman's Cove House, on Thursday, September 24th, the whole of every Description of Free Men and Women, and of Male and Female Prisoners, Tickets of Leave included, in the District and Vicinity of Herdman's Cove, Green Point, Black Brush, Old Beach, Tea-tree Brush, Dromedary Creek, Bagdad, Green-water Holes, Cross Marsh, Jericho, Rope-Walk, and Spring Hill, including all Stock-keepers as far as York Plains, and the Macquarie River.

At Mr. D. McCarty's, New Norfolk, on Friday, September 25th, all the Free Men and Women, on and off the Stores, in the District of New Norfolk, the Back Settlement, and

District of Melville; also those resident at the Fat-doe River, the Rivers Plenty and Styx, Stony-hut Plains, and all Out-Stations and Stock-yards in that Quarter.

On Saturday, September 26th, all the Male and Female Prisoners, Tickets of Leave included, within the said Districts.

The Muster will begin at Ten o'Clock in the Morning at the Places and on the Days stated.

At all these Musters the Free Women, as well those who came Free to this Colony, as those who are Free by Absolute or Conditional Pardon, and by Expiration of Sentence, are to attend and give in the Names and Ages of their Children. All Female Prisoners are also to give in the Names and Ages of their Children. And all Persons, Male and Female, whose Sentences have expired, will be required to produce their Certificates: those who have received Pardons and Emancipations must also produce them, and all Tickets of Leave to be exhibited.

The Settlers and Holders of Land and Stock will give in an Account of their Land in Cultivation, together with the Stock and Grain in their possession; and all such as hold Tickets of Occupation for Grazing Ground, dated September 29th, 1817, are required to produce them at these Musters, preparatory to a Renewal on the approaching September 29th.

It being impossible for the Musters to be taken accurately without the personal Attendance of all herein described, it is the LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR'S positive orders that every Person comprised within this Order do personally attend; and any who act in disobedience thereto, will incur immediate Forfeiture of all present and an exclusion from all future Indulgences; and all Persons who have People in their Employ, who are comprised in this Order, are required to warn them to attend at the Times and Places specified, for the several Districts in which they reside; and no Returns will be received from any Persons of those in their Employ, the personal Attendance of all being strictly enjoined.

All Public Officers will make a Return of the Land and Stock in their possession; and in order that all Stock-keepers may have opportunity of attending these Musters at the Place most convenient to their Employers, they are allowed to attend on any of the Days of Muster at the Place and District most convenient to their Grazing-ground.

Getting around this CD

Navigating Archive CD Books CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

Searching Text on Archive CD Books Australia CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched. The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

Different Versions of Adobe Acrobat Reader

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a “Find” and a “Search” tool. Those tools are two *totally* different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *FIND* tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a “Find” tool (not a “search” tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *FIND* tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a “Search” tool (not a tool labelled “Find”). HOWEVER — what is called “Search” is the same as the tool that used to be called “Find” Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *SEARCH* tool

Tips For Searching and Getting More From the CD Books

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering “rederi” if you want “Frederick”, but find that the letters “F” “c” and “k” are sometimes misread.
- use the “Match whole word” option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith.
- use the “Match case” option to eliminate all the occupations “smith” if you only want the name “Smith”.
- don’t just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
 - › look for others of the same name
 - › look for others who lived in the same place or street
 - › who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
 - › how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
 - › what churches were there and what time were services held?
 - › what other activities were there in the community?
 - › look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- all of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You can learn much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
- Many CDs have only one file, but some have the book content spread over several files. Adobe Reader normally searches in the file that is open at the time. If you wish to search ALL files at once choose the “All PDF documents in” option and select the CD drive or directory the files are in—Adobe Reader 6 only.
