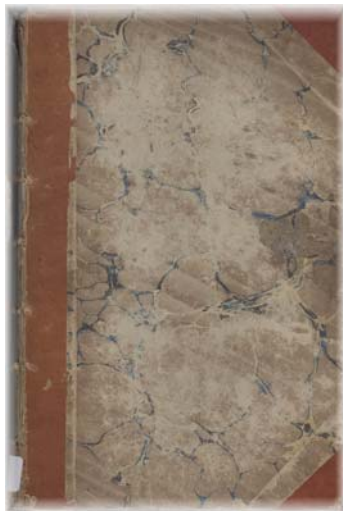

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that by an Act of the British Parliament passed in the Session of the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of British possessions abroad," it was enacted,

"That the privileges granted to Foreign Ships shall be limited to the Ships of those Countries which, having Colonial Possessions, shall grant the like privileges of trading with those Possessions to British Ships, or which, not having Colonial Possessions, shall place the Commerce and Navigation of this Country, and of its Possessions abroad, upon the footing of the most favored Nation, unless Her Majesty by her Order in Council shall in any case deem it expedient to grant the whole or any of such privileges to the Ships of any Foreign Country, although the conditions aforesaid shall not in all respects be fulfilled by such Foreign Country. Provided always, that no Foreign Country shall be deemed to have fulfilled the before mentioned conditions or to be entitled to the privileges aforesaid, unless and until Her Majesty shall by some order or orders by her made or to be made by the advice of her Privy Council, have declared that such Foreign Country hath so fulfilled the said Conditions, and is entitled to the said privileges."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act for consolidating and amending the Laws relating to the Licensing of Public Houses, and for further regulating the sale and consumption of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in New South Wales," it is amongst other things enacted, that no house for which either a Publican's General License or a Wine and Beer License shall be granted within the towns of Sydney, Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, and Bathurst, shall have any ingress or egress except in the street or streets named in the License for such house, and that every such license shall become void in case any other passage or entrance than the entrance named in such License shall be used, permitted, or allowed to such house;—and that if the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, shall cause a Proclamation to be published in the "Government Gazette," declaring the 40th section of the said Act to be applicable to any other town or towns in New South Wales, or if the Police Magistrate of any town in the said Colony shall cause a notice under his hand to be delivered to the person licensed, in respect to any house licensed as aforesaid, situated within the limits of any such town, that the said section of the said Act shall be applicable to the said house, then and in such cases respectively, the town or towns to be from time to time mentioned in any Proclamation or the Licensed House or Houses to be from time to time particularized in any such notice, shall from the expiration of one month from the date of such Proclamation or notice respectively, be subject to the prohibition and penalty therein made applicable to houses licensed as aforesaid within the said towns of Sydney, Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, and Bathurst, as fully as if the same had been also expressly included in the said section of the said Act.

Now therefore I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Governor of the said Colony, do, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited law or ordinance, by this my proclamation, hereby declare, that the provisions of the said 40th section of the said recited Act or Ordinance, shall be extended to and made applicable to the town of Melbourne in the District of Port Phillip; and that at the expiration of one month from the day of date hereof, the said 40th section of the said recited Act will become applicable to the town of Melbourne accordingly.

Getting around this CD

NAVIGATING ARCHIVE CD BOOKS CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

SEARCHING TEXT ON ARCHIVE CD BOOKS AUSTRALIA CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched.

The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

DIFFERENT VERSIONS OF ADOBE ACROBAT READER

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a "Find" and a "Search" tool. Those tools are two *totally* different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *FIND* tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a "Find" tool (not a "search" tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *FIND* tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a "Search" tool (not a tool labelled "Find")
HOWEVER — what is called "Search" is the same as the tool that used to be called "Find" Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the *SEARCH* tool

TIPS FOR SEARCHING AND GETTING MORE FROM THE CD BOOKS

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering "rederi" if you want "Frederick", but find that the letters "F" "c" and "k" are sometimes misread.
- use the "Match whole word" option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith
- use the "Match case" option when you want to eliminate all the occupations "smith" if you only want the name "Smith"
- Don't just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
 - look for others of the same name
 - look for others who lived in the same place or street
 - who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
 - how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
 - what churches were there and what time were services held?
 - what other activities were there in the community?
 - look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- All of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You could learn or write much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
